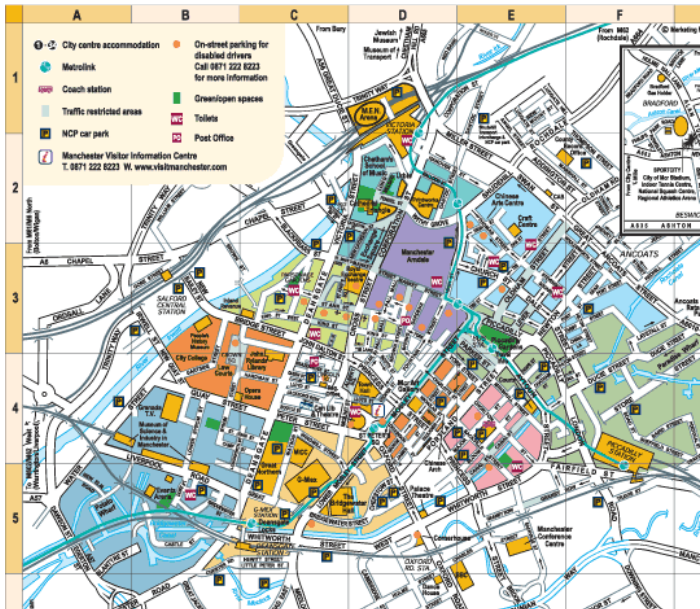

## Manchester

Manchester is a land-locked city located in the North West of England.

It is the UK's second largest city after London.

Most of Manchester is urban, although there are some rural areas

## Key Vocabulary

**Coast**— the land next to the sea.

**Landlocked**—having no direct access to the sea.

**City**—a large or important town.

**Climate**—the usual weather conditions in an area or place.

**Landmarks**— a building or place that is of historical or cultural importance.

**Man made**—produced, formed or made by humans.

**Natural**—existing in or formed by nature.

**Human geography**—features on the land that are made by humans.

**Physical geography**—features on the land that are formed by nature.

**Rural**—living in the country side.

**Urban**—living in a city.

**Population**—the number of people living in a place.

## Cape Town

Cape Town is South Africa's second largest city.

It has a warm climate and is located on the South-West coast.

One of it's most famous features is Table Top mountain that has a distinctive flat
