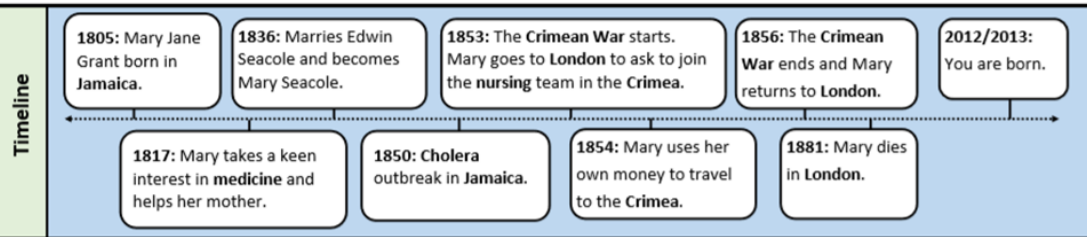

Nurse—a person who is trained to care for sick and injured people.

Patients—a person who is getting medical treatment.

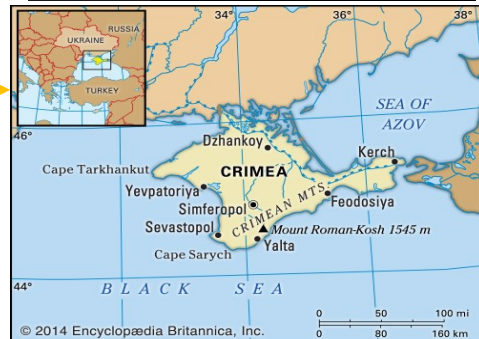
Remedy—a medicine or treatment.

Important Places

Jamaica—Mary was born in Kingston, Jamaica in 1805. Jamaica is an Island in the Caribbean and is home to 2.9 million people.

Crimea—Crimea is a peninsula in Eastern Europe that is surrounded by the Black Sea. The Crimean war started in October 1853 and ended in March 1856.



Early life

Mary 's mother taught her how to care for sick and injured soldiers by using herbal remedies and Jamaican folk treatments.

During the war

Mary was known as 'Mother Seacole' by the soldiers she cared for. She often treated injured soldiers on the battlefield as well as in the daily clinic that she ran.
