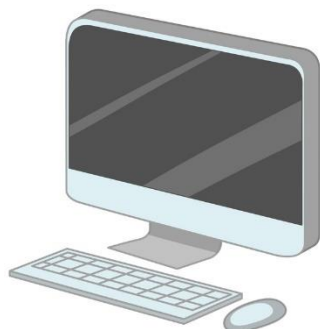
Computing

After a light warm-up of immobilising the arms, hips and ankles do the following.

Remember to start steady and keep good form throughout.

Do each exercise in any order but keep to the order, which will allow your body to recover.

- Dynamic Plank
- Lunges
- Squats
- Leg Raises
- Sit-ups

1st set x 10 (20s recovery between each type of exercise)

2nd set x 10 (20s recovery)

3rd set x 20 (30s recovery)

4th set x 10 (20s recovery)

5th set x 10 (20s recovery)

Remember to stay hydrated and rest for longer between sets if need be.

Science

Continuing on from our lesson last week, we are now going to look at how things move on different surfaces:

Step 1: Choose five different flat surfaces (e.g. carpet, table, grass)

Step 2: Choose an object that can roll (e.g. toy car, marble, ball, onion)

Step 3: Measure a 1m distance on your surface and mark the start line. If you don't have a measuring tool, use a non-standard unit of measurement i.e. three books, 7 pencils, to make a distance.

Step 4: Roll your object, to see how far it travels. Do this three times on each surface. Record each distance in the table below.

Step 5: Work out the average by adding up all three distances of the same surface and divide the total by three.

PSHE

You will need: a piece of paper, colouring pencils and colouring pens.

How to Use a Grid Reference

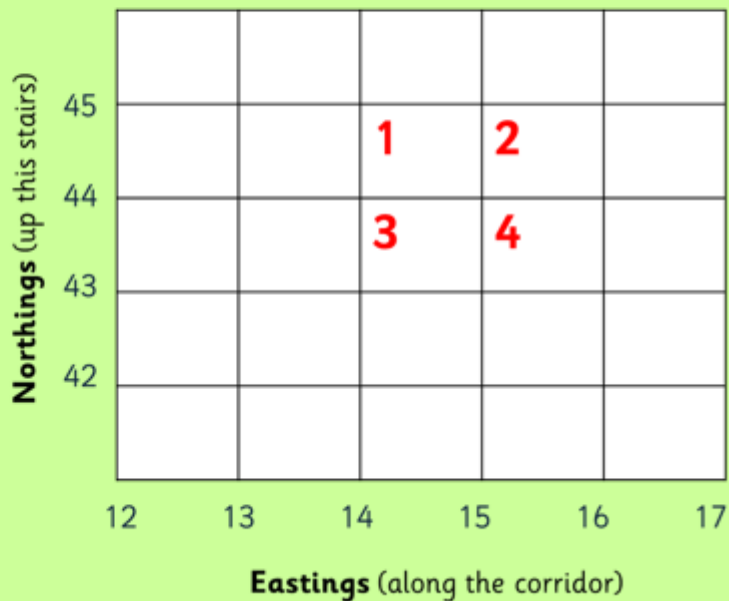


When giving a four-figure grid reference you use the **Eastings numbers first** followed by the **Northings numbers**.

An easy way to remember is to think '**along the corridor and up the stairs**'.

- 1 would be 14 44
- 2 = 15 44
- 3 = 14 43

What would 4 be?
