Complete one or two activities per day from the learning grid.

Science- Insect life cycle (45 minutes)



Look at the PP to discover key differences in different insect's life cycles.

Task- create two different life cycles. One insect that goes through metamorphosis changes and one that goes through incomplete metamorphosis changes.

Challenge- compare the two different life cycles. Can you find 3 similarities and 3 differences?

Art- The tin forest animals (45 minutes)

Watch and listen to the story again. Pay attention to the illustrations of the forest.

Can you now create a drawing of one individual animal, one tree or both together. Do not make them too complicated as this will make next week's work, very hard! You will need your drawing to be quite big (A4 size)

Geography- animals living in the rainforest (1 hour)



Look at the PP to learn about the animals that live in the Amazon Rainforest and how they have adapted to survive.

Task- Research other animals from the amazon rainforest to learn about how they have adapted. You could: write down your facts, draw a picture, create a poster, create your own PP or any other ways you would like to share the information you have found out.

PSHE- Can you write down a definition of a refugee? (30 minutes)

Try to think of some of the issues that a refugee or asylum seeker might face when coming to live in a new country.

Think about school and what you might take for granted.

Activity- Make a list of the top six things ALL children need in order to be able to learn.

Can you write a couple of paragraphs on what you need in order to learn effectively and how we may take some of these things for granted?

RE-Are Sikh stories important today? (45 minutes)

Read the story Bhai Lalo and Malik Bhago on the PP. There is also a video, if you would like to hear Mrs Dickinson read the story to you.

Think about how the meaning of this story is still relevant today.

Activity- Can you think about these questions and write your thoughts down? Is it still important to treat people equally in today's world? Where do you think there is still inequality? What can be one to try to remove inequality? Think about gender, disability, race, money, religion.



Music- (30 minutes)

Listen and Appraise - Listen again to Make You Feel My Love by Adele and Make You Feel My Love by Bob Dylan. What differences can you hear? Why might artists 'cover' a popular song?

Now listen to Someone You Loved - Lewis Capaldi.

What are the similarities between this and the Adele track?

PE- Can you tackle the Gherkin?

The Gherkin is a very famous building in London. It has 1,037 steps over 38 floors. That's an average of 27-28 steps per flight. Can you ascend that many steps this week? Use your stairs at home or flights of steps out and about. Good Luck! #thighburner
