<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maths</u></p> <p>Can you revise your place value 1-20? How many tens and how many ones are in each number? You could use your Lego or some cereal to represent numbers like in the photographs below. Challenge: numbers 20-50</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Science</u></p> <p>The Knight is looking for a bag for his HEAVY armour. He needs a 'suitable' bag. What is a 'suitable' bag like? What properties must it have? It must be strong/not break or tear easily. Maybe waterproof.</p> <p>Can you investigate which bag would be best for him to use? Find 3 different types of bags and investigate which one is most suitable for him to use.</p> <p>What do you notice? Can you draw a picture of (record) what happened/ you found out?</p> <p><i>For example: a paper bag, a cardboard gift style bag, a plastic bag. You could test the strength of each bag by filling it with heavy items like tins. You could test if the bags are waterproof by pouring/dripping/getting the bags wet. Keep it the same each time to make it fair. Use the same weight. Use the same amount of water.</i></p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Music - Recognising Phrasing and Rhythm</u></p> <p>Watch the following videos to remind yourself what syllables are: Counting syllables - Year 1 - P2 - English - Catch Up Lessons - Home Learning with BBC Bitesize - BBC Bitesize KS1 English: Syllables with Joe Tracini - BBC Teach</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can you practise clapping along to each syllable as your grown up reads your favourite story to you – rhyming stories are good for this like The Gruffalo / Stick Man. Can you clap out the syllables in your full name? Can you find things around the house that have 1 syllable in their word – what about 2 / 3 / 4 / 5 syllables? 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Just for fun!</u></p> <p>Create your own sensory ice block!</p> <p>You could use natural materials or something from around the house.</p> <p>Freeze the water in a cup, bowl or freezer bag and enjoy exploring the next day!</p> <p>What do you notice? What happens to your ice block?</p>

What are your family member's favourite fruits and vegetables? Can you design a poster to encourage your friends to eat more healthy fruit and vegetables? What were Jester's hired to do? <p>Pretend that you are a jester!
