<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Geography</u></p> <p>This week we will be looking in more depth at the features of a location. We can sort these features into two groups, physical features and human features. Physical features are those that are natural and already part of an area and its landscape. These could be things like mountains, cliffs, or a forest. Human features are those that have been made by humans, for example things like houses, cathedrals, and shops.</p> <p>Complete the sorting activity below and sort the features into the two columns, one for physical features and one for human features. You can either complete this as a cut and stick activity, or by drawing your own table and writing the different features into each column.</p> <p>Then have a go at doing your own research or use the maps below to find some features of Chester and Rome.
