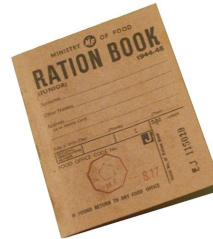
Changes in my life (reception)

Chronological: When something is in chronological order, it is in order of when it happened.

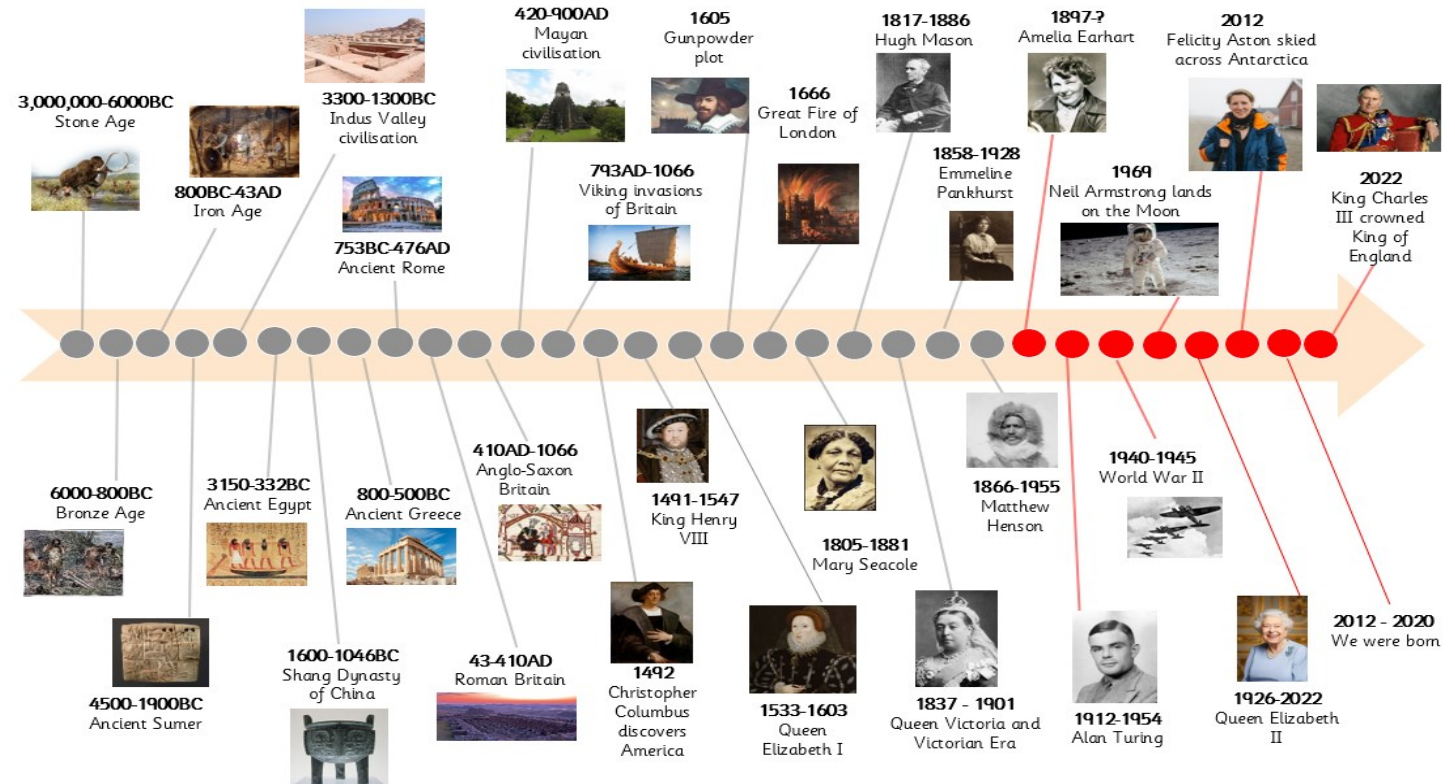
Compare: Looking for similarities and differences
